COURSE OVERVIEW

The Graduate Certificate in Health Management is a postgraduate course that aims to build core knowledge and skills in students and healthcare professionals through development of enhanced knowledge and understanding of contemporary issues in healthcare, self, individual and team leadership and quality, safe, collaborative healthcare practice and delivery.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Demonstrate the leadership capabilities required to effectively manage self, individuals and teams in the delivery of healthcare.
- Evaluate current healthcare challenges to improve the quality of healthcare delivery.
- Design appropriate strategies to address current quality and safety challenges in healthcare.
- Develop plans to build and improve own leadership and management capabilities to enhance collaborative practice to address current and future organisational needs.

ASSESSMENT METHODS

Assessments are designed to maintain academic standards and generate evidence of learning through a focus on the quality of learning outcomes, the use of a combination of two or more assessment tasks which reflect the learning objectives of the unit, with assessment spread across the teaching period, the importance of the learning objectives reflected in the relative weightings of assessments; and providing students with the opportunity to demonstrate a range of competencies in learning from minimum learning standards to learning of the highest standard. The assessment methods include Research essays, reflective journal, designing a healthcare management plan and designing a performance improvement project plan synchronous activities including quizzes, case study discussions, discussing a topic through a review of literature, critical appraisal of a published paper.

PATHWAYS

This course is nested within the Diploma in Health Management and the Master of Health Management. Successful completion of the 24 credit points required for award of the Graduate Certificate will enable entry into the Graduate Diploma in Health Management if all other stated entry criteria are met.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the Graduate Certificate in Health Management is based on the following requirements:

- An undergraduate degree in a field relevant to healthcare (see list below) and evidence of relevant professional experience or volunteer work in a health context. OR;

- A graduate diploma or graduate certificate in a health-related field (See list below) and evidence of relevant professional experience or volunteer work in a health context. OR;

- Alternate Entry: Satisfy CHS by means of evidence of extensive professional experience by submitting a Statement of Service from their employer/s and/or a resume outlining a minimum of three years' full-time (or equivalent) relevant professional experience. OR;

- Special Entry: In the absence of professional health registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) or levels or 6 VET qualifications, evidence of more substantial (5 years minimum) recent work experience in a discipline is required.

- To apply for alternate entry/ special entry of Graduate Certificate, you must provide evidence of extensive professional experience by submitting a Statement of Service from your employer/s and/or a resume outlining a full-time (or equivalent) relevant professional experience in a health context.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

- An IELTS Academic overall score of at least 6.5 with no band less than 6.0; or

- A TOEFL Internet Based Test overall score of at least 90 with no less than 21 in the writing component; or

- PTE overall 58 with a writing score of at least 50; or

- Satisfactory completion of EAP 2 Grade A at ELSIS College.

Please note: CHS requires students to take undertake a short enrolment assessment in each student's first trimester. This assessment helps CHS identify students who may need additional learning and/or English language support. Such tests are used in many Australian universities and institutes of higher education.
